



Petitions review 2010/11

1. Petitions Data

- 1.1 On-line petitions went live on 14/12/10; petitions that pre-dated this have also been uploaded onto the web portal. This report therefore covers the period from 1/4/10 to 31/3/11.
- 1.2 The petition scheme has proved extremely popular and numerous petitions about budgets cuts to libraries and day centres were received. The table below shows a breakdown and analysis of the petitions that were received:

- 1.3 The feedback from residents has been very positive and petition organisers have commented on how easy it is to use the petitions web portal.
- 1.4 A significant benefit of an on-line petition is that signatures are authenticated as petitioners are required to register their email address before their signature is accepted.
