What is an apprenticeship and where can it take you?

An apprenticeship gives you hands-on experience, a salary and the opportunity to train while you work in one of many different industries.

An apprenticeship is a real job. It's a way to:

- Earn a salary and learn at the same time, with at least 20% of your time set aside for learning
- Gain skills and qualifications, ranging from Level 2 (GCSE equivalent) up to degree level
- Start a long-term career path with the possibility of higher earnings.

Who are apprenticeships for?

There is no upper age limit. If you're 16+ then an apprenticeship could be for you.

Opportunities are available across a huge range of industries, including media, engineering, hospitality, finance and healthcare.

What will I earn?

Pay is dependent on the industry, location and the type of apprenticeship.

Many employers pay substantially more than the apprenticeship minimum wage, which is:

- £3.70 per hour for those aged 16-18
- £3.70 per hour if you are over 19 and in your first year of your apprenticeship after that you are entitled to the National Minimum Wage.

Remember, if you complete a higher or degree apprenticeship, you'll have no university debt; you'll have been earning for the length of your apprenticeship with no tuition fees.
