Appendix 3: Model Conditions

## 1 Background

- When deciding to grant or vary a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003, the
  licensing authority (the London Borough of Hounslow) may do so subject to conditions
  which it considers necessary, proportionate and appropriate for the promotion of the
  four licensing objectives.
- 2. In carrying out its licensing functions the London Borough of Hounslow will have regard to the most recent *Guidance* issued under the Licensing Act 2003 by the Secretary of State. The most recent Guidance states that conditions on a premises licence or club premises certificate are important in setting the parameters within which premises can lawfully operate.
- 3. The licensing authority will need to be satisfied that it is *appropriate* to impose conditions to promote one or more of the four licensing objectives. Conditions should be tailored to the particular circumstance/s of an individual licensed premises and determined on a case-by-case basis.
- 4. Standardised conditions which ignore these individual aspects should be avoided (excluding the Mandatory Conditions which apply to all premises). The London Borough of Hounslow, the licensing authority, will not regard these model conditions as standard conditions to be automatically imposed in all cases and the Guidance also urges partnership working to promote the licensing objectives.
- 5. Conditions which are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives should emerge initially from the prospective licence holders' own risk assessment and these can then form part of the *operating schedule* for the premises.
- 6. Once an application has been made, the police, environmental health service, other responsible authorities, and other persons are encouraged to engage with the applicant if they are considering making a *representation* to the application. This basket of model conditions has been produced to assist all parties and promote a consistent approach when proposing conditions for a premises licence.
- 7. If concerns remain, the responsible authorities will discuss these concerns and will, where appropriate, jointly suggest amendments and or new conditions to the applicant.
- 8. This basket of model conditions is *not* an exclusive or exhaustive list of conditions which may be included on a premises licence. It does not restrict any applicant, responsible authority, or other person from proposing any alternative conditions, nor would it restrict a licensing sub-committee from imposing any other reasonable condition on a licence it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 9. Model conditions are listed numerically, and an index is included for ease of reference.

## **Model Conditions**

No	Wording
1	The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Hounslow Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.
2	A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
3	There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
4	No drinks shall be served in glass containers at any time.
5	A minimum of ( <b>insert number</b> ) Security Industry Authority (SIA) licensed door supervisors shall be on duty at the premises at all times whilst it is open for business.
6	At least ( <b>insert number</b> ) Security Industry Authority (SIA) licensed door supervisors shall be on duty at the entrance of the premises at all times whilst it is open for business.
7	No patrons shall be admitted or re-admitted to the premises after ( <b>insert time</b> ) unless they have passed through a metal detecting search arch and, if the search arch is activated or at the discretion of staff, then physically searched, which will include a 'pat down search' and a full bag search.
8	All persons entering or re-entering the premises shall be searched by Security Industry Authority (SIA) SIA licensed member of staff and monitored by the premises CCTV system.
9	All staff engaged outside the entrance to the premises, or supervising or controlling queues, shall wear high visibility yellow jackets or vests.

10	Customers shall not enter or leave the premises from / by (insert specific entrances or exits), except in the event of an emergency.
11	A noise limiter must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service, so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents or businesses. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured by key or password to the satisfaction of officers from the Environmental Health Service and access shall only be by persons authorised by the Premises Licence holder. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be affected without prior knowledge of an authorised Officer of the Environmental Health Service. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
12.	No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises. Nor shall any vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
13	Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
14	All windows and external doors shall be kept closed after (insert time) hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
15	There shall be no admittance or re-admittance to the premises after (insert time) except for patrons permitted to temporarily leave the premises to smoke.
16	There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises after ( <b>insert time</b> ).
17	All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only and shall not be consumed on the premises.
18	Alcohol consumed outside the premises building shall only be consumed by patrons seated at tables.
19	All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by (insert time) each day.
20	All tables and chairs shall be removed from the outside area by (insert time) each day.
21	Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
22	Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall be limited to ( <b>insert number</b> ) persons at any one time.
23	Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
24	A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.

25	An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time that it is in use.	
26	The licence holder shall ensure that any queue to enter the premises which forms outside the premises is orderly and supervised by door staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction to the public highway.	
27	All tills shall automatically prompt staff to ask for age verification identification when presented with an alcohol sale.	
28	Outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol and whilst the premises are open to the public, the licence holder shall ensure that all alcohol within the premises (including alcohol behind the counter) is secured in a locked store room or behind locked grilles, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by both customers and staff.	
29	No super-strength beer, lagers, ciders or spirit mixtures of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises, except for premium beers and ciders supplied in glass bottles.	
30	No single cans or bottles of beer or cider or spirit mixtures shall be sold at the premises.	
31	No more than ( <b>insert percentage</b> ) % of the sales area shall be used at any one time for the sale, exposure for sale, or display of alcohol.	
32	There shall be no self-service of spirits on the premises, save for spirit mixtures less than 5.5% ABV.	
33	Prominent signage indicating the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol shall be displayed so as to be visible before entering the premises, where alcohol is on public display, and at the point of sale.	
34	All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.	
35	No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between ( <b>insert time</b> ) hours and <b>(insert time</b> ) hours on the following day.	
36	Sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall only be supplied with, and ancillary to a take-away meal.	
37	The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one-time (including staff) shall not exceed ( <b>insert total number of</b> ) persons.	
38	The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.	
39	The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.	
40	Admission to the (specified function room) shall be through the premises lobby area only	

41	Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
42	During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
43	No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between (insert time) and (insert time) on the following day.
44	[Other than in hotel bedrooms] There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.
45	No advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services shall be inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or be distributed to the public.
46	There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises.
47	A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) Hologram.
48	A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of Hounslow Council at all times whilst the premises is open.
49	An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Hounslow Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
	<ul> <li>(a) all crimes reported to the venue</li> <li>(b) all ejections of patrons</li> <li>(c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder</li> <li>(d) any incidents of disorder</li> <li>(e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons</li> <li>(f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment</li> <li>(g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol</li> <li>(h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.</li> </ul>
50	No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the licensing authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the District Surveyor's Association – Technical Standards

	for Places of Entertainment and the reasonable requirements of Hounslow Environmental Health Consultation Team, at which time this condition shall be removed from the licence by the licensing authority.
51	Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged, operated and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the licensing authority where consent has not previously been given.
	<ul> <li>dry ice and cryogenic fog</li> <li>smoke machines and fog generators</li> <li>pyrotechnics including fireworks</li> <li>firearms</li> <li>lasers</li> <li>explosives and highly flammable substances.</li> <li>real flame.</li> </ul>
	strobe lighting.
52	No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.
	NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.
53	In relation to the (specified function room) there shall be no admission after (midnight) other than to (1) residents of the hotel and their bona fide guests, or (2) persons attending a pre-booked function.
54	Licensable activities at events in the (specified function room) shall only be provided at pre-booked ticketed events.
55	With the exception of residents and their bona fide guests, no alcohol shall be consumed more than (30) minutes after the permitted terminal hour for the supply of alcohol
56	There shall be no sales of hot food or hot drink for consumption off the premises after 23.00hrs.
57	Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
58	No person on behalf of the premises or on behalf of a person carrying or attempting to carry on a licensable activity shall cause, permit, employ or allow, <i>directly</i> or <i>indirectly</i> , whether on payment or otherwise, any person(s) to importune, solicit or tout members of the public on any public highway within the specified area outlined below for the purpose of bringing customers to the premises. The distribution of leaflets or similar promotional material is also prohibited within the <i>specified area</i> .
	For the purpose of this section:
	'Directly' means: employ, have control of or instruct.  'Indirectly' means allowing / permitting the service of or through a third party.

	'Specified' Area' means the area encompassed within (insert name of boundary roads.)
59	Prior to any "designated sporting event" (as defined in the Sporting Events Control of Alcohol Act 1985) the premises licence holder shall ensure that;
	(i) Alcohol sales in respect of cans of beer or cider are limited to no more than 4 cans per person for a minimum of four hours before the commencement of the relevant designated sporting event;
	(ii) No sales of alcohol in bottles or glass containers are made in the period four hours before the commencement of the designated sporting event;
	(iii) Alcohol sales cease for a period of one hour immediately before the commencement of the relevant designated sporting event;
	(iv) On any day where there is a relevant designated sporting event taking place, the premises will not externally advertise as a result of a local store promotion the availability of beer or cider in such a way as to be likely to be the sole inducement to attract persons to the premises who are either attending the designated sporting event or in the vicinity of the premises as a result of the designated sporting event;
	(v) All members of staff working at the premises are informed of this condition prior to taking up employment;
	(vi) On the day of the relevant designated sporting event, upon the direction of a police officer, using the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder or public safety, the premises will immediately cease to sell alcohol until further directed by the police or until the relevant designated sporting event has finished.
60	The licence holder shall enter into an agreement with a hackney carriage and/or private carriage firm to provide transport for customers, with contact numbers made readily available to customers who will be encouraged to use such services.
61	Notwithstanding condition (38 / 66), alcohol may be supplied and consumed prior to their meal in the bar area (designated on the plan), by up to a maximum at any one time, of (12) persons dining at the premises.
62	No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until premises licence insert licence number (or such other number subsequently issued for the premises) has been surrendered [and is incapable of resurrection].
63	As soon as possible, and in any event within 1 month from the grant of this licence, the premises shall join the local Pubwatch or other local crime reduction scheme approved by the police, and local radio scheme if available.
64	Queuing outside the premises shall be restricted to a designated area located at (specify location).
65	No deliveries to the premises shall take place between (23.00hrs) and (08.00hrs) on the following day.
66	The premises shall only operate as a restaurant: (i) in which customers are shown to their table, (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,

(iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption, (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal. 67 Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises to smoke shall be restricted to a designated smoking area defined as (set out location). 68 All external emergency exit doors shall be fitted with sensor alarms and visible indicators to alert staff when the doors have been opened. 69 a. All drinking vessels used in the venue shall be polycarbonate. All drinks in glass bottles are to be decanted into polycarbonate containers or polycarbonate carafes prior to being served, with the exception of champagne or bottles of spirits with a minimum size of 70cl supplied by waiter/waitress service to tables. Staff shall clear all empty champagne and spirit bottles promptly from the tables. Customers shall not be permitted to leave their table carrying any such glass bottles or drink directly from the bottle. b. Notwithstanding a) above, with the written agreement of the Hounslow Licensing Police, a copy of which will be held at the premises' reception, glass drinking vessels may be used for private or pre-booked events within the (specified area). 70 The sale and supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be restricted to alcohol consumed at the outside tables and chairs shown on the licence plan, shall be by waiter or waitress service, served only to a person seated taking a substantial table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal. 70A The sale and supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be restricted to alcohol consumed by persons who are seated in an area appropriately authorised for the use of tables and chairs on the highway and bona fide taking a substantial table meal there, and where the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such a meal, and where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only. 71 The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.

72	The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.	
73	The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.	
74	All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.	
75	All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.	
76	The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.	
77	Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.	
78	All fabrics, curtains, drapes and similar features including materials used in finishing and furnishing shall be either non-combustible or be durably or inherently flame-retarded fabric. Any fabrics used in escape routes (other than foyers), entertainment areas or function rooms, shall be non-combustible.	
79	The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the licensing authority upon written request.	
	a. Any permanent or temporary emergency lighting battery or system	
	b. Any permanent or temporary electrical installation	
	c. Any permanent or temporary emergency warning system.	
80	Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties, save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime.	
81	No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the licensing authority.	
82	The variation of this premises licence (state the licensing reference number) to include the (state the works requested and plans reference) will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Team at which time this condition shall be removed from this licence by the licensing authority.	

83	The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol and the provision of latenight refreshment from the terminal hour for those activities on New Year's Eve through to the commencement time for those activities on New Year's Day.	
84	On the morning that Greenwich Mean Time changes to British Summer Time one hour will be added to the terminal hour of any activities and to the closing time for the premises where the existing terminal hour for the activities and/or closing hour for the premises ends after 01.00.	
85	No miniature bottles of spirits of 20 cl or below shall be sold from the premises.	
86	The licensable activities authorised by this licence and provided at the premises shall be ancillary to the main function of the (premises/building) as (offices / delicatessen / museum / theatre / hairdressers / etc).	
87	No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.	
88	Alcohol may only be sold for consumption by members of a private club and their bona fide guests (not exceeding (4) guests per member). No person shall be admitted to membership of the private club or be entitled to take advantage of any of the privileges of membership without an interval of at least 48 hours between their nomination or application for membership and their admission.	
89	A list of the names and addresses of members of the Club shall be kept on the premises at all times together with a book showing the names and dates of attendance of any guests introduced by members. Both the list and the book shall be produced on demand for inspection by the police or an authorised officer of the Council.	
90	No licensable activities shall take at the premises until the capacity of the premises has been determined by the Environmental Health Team and the licensing authority has replaced this condition on the licence with a condition detailing the capacity so determined.	
91	The number of persons accommodated at the premises (excluding staff) shall not exceed ( <b>insert number</b> ). Subject to the sanitary accommodation being improved to the satisfaction of the Council's Environmental Health Officer, the capacity may be increased to such number as may be agreed with the licence holder. The actual capacity will only increase when an appropriate condition to that effect has replaced this condition on the licence.	
92	In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:	
	(a) The police (and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay;	

	(b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the police;
	(c) The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the police; and
	(d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.
93	The consumption of alcohol on the premises shall cease at (insert hour).
94	Alcohol shall only be sold for consumption by persons attending a pre- booked and bona fide private function or event to which members of the public are not admitted. A register of persons attending the event shall be kept at the premises and made available for immediate inspection by police or an authorised officer of the Council.
95	Notwithstanding the mandatory condition imposed by Section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003, the exhibition of films pursuant to this licence will be restricted to films that have been classified as Universal (U) or Parental Guidance (PG) by the film classification body designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
96	The premises will stock a wide range (insert number) of non-alcoholic beverages in prominent shelf positions.
97	The premises will provide a bin or bins outside which will be subject to regular emptying.
