- 1. The London Borough of Hounslow hereby gives notice that on 15 November 2021 it made the above Orders under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into operation on 18 November 2021.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders will be to make permanent the experimental:
 - a) closure of Dan Mason Drive at the railway bridge;
 - b) no entry into Duke Road from Chiswick High Road;
 - c) northbound closure of Harvard Hill at its junction with Great West Road;
 - d) 'diagonal road closure' of Staveley Road at its junction with Park Road;
 - e) prohibition on motor vehicles turning right into Lawford Road from Park Road;
 - f) prohibition on motor vehicles, except those requiring access, from proceeding in Grove Park Road (between its junctions with Grove Park Terrace and Thames Road), Strandon-the-Green, and Thames Road, Chiswick; and
 - g) prohibition on motor vehicles, except permit holders, from proceeding north-westbound in Hartington Road in the vicinity of its junction with Chiswick Quay.

- iv) providing a response to an emergency at the request of an NHS ambulance service;
- v) bomb or explosive disposal;
- vi) special forces;
- vii) police;
- viii) National Crime Agency.
- d) the vehicle is being used in the service of the Council in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for that vehicle to enter the prohibited area; or
- e) the vehicle is proceeding with the permission of or at the direction of a police constable in uniform, or a person duly authorised by the Council.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order introduces restrictions on motor vehicles, except permit holders, entering a section of Hartington Road, Chiswick in the vicinity of its junction with Chiswick Quay.

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Hartington Road – Experimental Access Restriction

Statement of Reasons

The London Borough of Hounslow has made the decision to implement an experimental traffic order to restrict motor vehicle access in a section of Hartington Road.

This is to reduce the amount of through traffic and to prioritise the safety of pedestrians and cyclist.

Access will be permitted for permit holders.

The access restriction will be in place for a minimum of 6 months, after which the it will be reviewed to determine if it should be made permanent.
