



The funeral procession of Her Royal Highness, Queen Elizabeth II through Hounslow

Essential information

Please put safety first when you are watching the event.

- Do not stray onto the road - stay behind the barriers at all times.
- Only throw single flowers behind the procession – do not throw anything directly at the vehicles. Please ensure all wrapping is removed from any flowers and do not throw or leave bouquets, teddies or other objects.
- Tributes can be placed at war memorials and places of worship across the borough.
- Please respect others – give those around you plenty of room and please take your litter home with you.
- In case of emergency please alert one of our route ambassadors or a police officer/paramedic. Alternatively use your phone to dial 999.
- There are no public toilets along the procession route and portaloos will be limited - and queues may be long!
- When the procession has passed, please disperse in a calm, respectful manner.
- If you have Covid symptoms, we would strongly encourage you not to attend.

Travel information

- Parking is restricted along the route.
- Please avoid driving and do not park on residential streets.
- The best way to travel will be by foot for short distances (where possible) or via nearby public transport options.
- All major London train stations will have extra staff around to help you on your journey.
- Off-Peak tickets can be used on National Rail services on Monday 19 September – the day of Her Majesty's funeral.
- After the funeral procession has passed and you have dispersed from the route, you may want to consider the timing of your final journey home. London and Windsor will be very busy.
- Check journeys through Transport for London (www.tfl.gov.uk)
- The borough's parks and open spaces remain open so you can find a walking route through them and use them as a quiet space. Find your nearest at www.hounslow.gov.uk/parks
- The procession route is closed to all traffic. This includes bicycles, scooters and other forms of transport.



Safety information

- Please keep your personal belongings with you at all times.
- Do not leave bags or items unattended.
- If you see an unattended item or anything suspicious do not approach it. Please alert a police officer, ambassador or call 999.
- If you feel unwell, please alert a route ambassador.
- Please avoid bringing pets to the procession, such as dogs, unless it is a guide dog. If you must bring a dog ensure it is always well-behaved and kept on a short leash.
