Christmas and New Year Collections 2023

Hounslow's collection team will be working hard over the Christmas and New Year period to continue carrying out residents' recycling and waste collections. Both the Garden Waste and Bulky Waste collection service will be suspended for two weeks over this period to assist with the additional workload. The last day of these services will be **Friday**, **22 December 2023** and they will resume on **Monday**, **8 January 2024**.

Space Waye Re-use and Recycling Centre will be closed on **Monday 25** and **Tuesday 26 December**, as well as **Monday, 1 January, 2024**.

How can I recycle more?

Rethink, reduce, reuse, recycle: Our priority should always be to buy, consume and waste less. Here is what you can do with some common household items this Christmas.

Small electricals

If you have an electrical item that is still in good working condition you could consider selling it or passing it on to someone. Alternatively, we can collect these as part of your kerbside recycling service. The general rule is if the item (including the cord) fits in a (clearly labelled) carrier bag we can collect it. Please place this alongside your kerbside recycling boxes for collection. More information around what we can collect can be found here:



Textiles

Clothes and shoes are often a popular gift at Christmas, consider donating, selling, or recycling your old or unwanted items.

You can donate your unwanted (but good quality) clothes and shoes to a local charity shop or sell these to make some extra money. Alternatively, you can recycle these through your kerbside recycling service, you need to present them in a clearly labelled carrier bag and place them next to your recycling boxes on collection day. Furniture

Need to get rid of large items?





Making space for new furniture or clearing out to make space for hosting? You can donate good quality unwanted furniture to the Hounslow furniture project **www.hounslowct.org. uk/furniture-recycling** or you could give them away through the Freegle (or similar) app. Alternatively, you can use a local reuse and recycling site to dispose of your bulky items, more information around Christmas opening times and for terms and conditions please visit the sites website prior to visiting **www.hounslow.gov.uk/spacewaye**

Help ensure a cleaner and greener Hounslow by reducing your waste and recycling right this Christmas!

Things to remember:

If you have additional recycling, please present this in a clearly labelled carrier bag alongside your recycling boxes. Plt is important that you present the contents of the recycling in the same way you would when using your boxes. For example, all plastic and cans (red box) should be included in one bag, all paper and cardboard (blue box) should be in another, and glass (green box) in another. If these are mixed, the additional recycling will not be collected.



Cardboard boxes must be flattened, and pieces should be no bigger than 70x70cm in to fit within our recycling vehicles.

Excess waste left next to or on top of your wheeled bin will not be collected. Please keep this waste until your next rubbish collection date, or you can take it to Hounslow's Space Waye Household Reuse and Recycling Centre (TW14 0TH). Do not put old batteries in your recycling box. Disposing of batteries incorrectly can cause fires and be extremely dangerous for our collection crews. Batteries can be taken to any local retailer that sells batteries as they offer a disposal service — residents may also recycle used batteries at any library in Hounslow. Keep our collection team safe by ensuring all aerosol cans are completely empty before recycling them in your red box—aerosol cans that are not completely empty can pose a fire risk at our materials handling facility and cause injury to our crew.

Real Christmas trees will be collected in January 2024 between Monday, 8 January and Friday, 19 January. You will need to place your real Christmas tree (with lights and decorations removed) on the boundary of your property, not on the pavement, by 7am for collection.

Please note that artificial Christmas trees will not be collected.

Redlees Park - Worton Road car park TW7 6DW

Bedfont Lakes - Clockhouse Lane car park TW14 8QA

Space Waye - North Feltham Trading Estate, Pier Road, Feltham TW14 0TH

How could you make your Christmas more 'green'?

At Christmas we know that we may generate more recycling and rubbish whether it be wrapping paper, packaging, or food. We want to encourage our residents to support a circular economy: use less and reuse, repair and recycle more this Christmas season. It is good for the planet and good for your pocket.

Consider buying used?

Instead of purchasing new gifts consider shopping used. Check out charity shops, antique shops, eBay or Facebook marketplace. You'll save money and reduce your carbon footprint at the same time!

Minimise food waste -

buy only what you need and get creative with leftovers. If you have bought too much consider donating to a local food bank or use a food sharing app such as Surplus to Supper or OLIO. For all unavoidable food waste make sure to recycle this in your food waste bin.

Shop local –

reduce your emissions and support small and local businesses. Check out local shops, farmer's markets, or family-owned businesses for unique finds.

Save energy –

swap out incandescent lights for LED lights on your Christmas tree, surprisingly if every UK household did this, we could save more than £11 million or 29,000 tonnes of CO2 just over the 12 days of Christmas! LED lights use up to 80% less energy than incandescent lights, save yourself some money and reduce your carbon footprint.

Wrapping paper and Christmas cards —

avoid shiny, glittery or foil wrapping paper and Christmas cards as these cannot be recycled. Before recycling wrapping paper, do the scrunch test - if it stays scrunched then it can be recycled. Remember to remove all sticky tape, labels, or decorations.
