Statement of Reasons

Proposed traffic signal control crossing – Syon Lane, Isleworth

The Council is proposing to convert a zebra crossing to a traffic signal control crossing with pedestrian countdown (pedex) in Syon Lane, Isleworth, adjacent to Macfarlane Lane, Isleworth.

The conversion of the zebra crossing to a signalised pedex crossing will help to improve the flow of traffic in the peak periods and will benefit the visually impaired. The pedex provides audible and tactile awareness with the bleeping sound when the green man is lit and a tactile cone which rotates under the button panel.
