Increasing the number of venues that are trained to recognise, handle and report abuse and harassment.	The Council will deliver specialised training around recognising signs and responding to domestic abuse disclosures to dentists and opticians to enhance their ability to support their patients.

Improving the effectiveness of protection measures available to women and girls.	Safer Homes, the Council's security provision for victims of domestic abuse continues to provide protection measures. It ensures the person experiencing domestic abuse can securely remain in their home in most circumstances with extra security provisions to make them feel safe.
Increasing the number of domestic abuse perpetrators who change their harmful behaviours.	The Council will work in collaboration with the Police to implement the DRIVE Partnership which works with high harm, high risk and serial perpetrators of domestic abuse to prevent their abusive behaviour and protect victims.
Increasing the number of women and girls who feel safe in public spaces.	The Council will work in partnership with the Police to identify a public space and collaborate with women and girls to enhance and transform the area, creating a welcoming environment that reflects their needs and ideas.
