Our client intends to make some minor amendments to the current layout of their premises which, slightly, affect the licensable area permitted under the existing Bingo Premises Licence; there are several of the minopr amends.

- To remove a wall which currently forms a partition between the reception and gaming machine area and this will, in turn, extend the licensable area ever so slightly at the front of the building.
- The "fabric partitions" currently shown on the existing plan are being removed
