a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

The premises will continue to operate responsibly and will implement appropriate measures to support the licensing objectives at all times. As part of the proposed 24-hour operation, the business will ensure effective supervision, maintain comprehensive CCTV coverage, and follow robust staff training procedures to prevent crime and disorder. Public safety will be prioritised through consistent staffing, regular safety checks, and clear operational procedures. To prevent public nuisance—particularly important in a residential area—the premises will manage noise, control customer behaviour, and schedule deliveries and waste removal at suitable times. In addition, strong safeguarding policies and responsible management will protect children from harm. These combined measures ensure that the extended hours can be delivered without negatively affecting the local community and in full support of all four licensing objectives.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- Appropriate staffing levels will be in place throughout the night to supervise customers and ensure safe use of the premises.
- All emergency exits, lighting, and pathways will be checked routinely, especially during late-night trading hours.
- First-aid-trained staff will be on shift at all times.
- Overnight cleaning and maintenance schedules will be organised to avoid hazards.

c) Public safety

- Adequate staffing levels will be maintained throughout the night to ensure customer safety.
- All emergency exits, lighting, and safety equipment will be inspected regularly and kept unobstructed.
- The premises will maintain clear signage for exits and maximum occupancy.
- Hot-food and equipment safety procedures will continue to be followed during extended hours, with staff trained in first aid and fire safety.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- A **strict closed-door policy** will be implemented between 23:00–07:00 to prevent noise escaping.
- Outdoor areas will not be used during night-time hours.
- Signage at exits will remind customers to **leave quietly and respect neighbours**.
- Deliveries, waste collection, and disposal will be scheduled **during daytime hours only** to avoid disturbance.
- Staff will perform routine checks outside the premises to ensure no noise or litter impacts the local area.

e) The protection of children from harm

- As a café/dessert lounge, no age-restricted entertainment or alcohol is provided, reducing risks.
- Staff will be trained to identify vulnerable young people, especially during late-night hours, and provide assistance when needed.
- Clear procedures will be in place to ensure minors are accompanied late at night, where appropriate.
- Access to staff-only or hazardous areas (e.g., kitchen) will remain secure at all times.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the

ANNEX 1 - TABLE OF MANDATORY CONDITIONS UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003

1. That no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. That every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
4. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
5. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - a) a holographic mark
 - b) an ultraviolet feature
6. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
7. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,



- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

9. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1) The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Hounslow Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available upon the request of Police or authorised council officer as soon as possible and during opening hours.
- 2) A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.



- 3) All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive regular training in the Licensing Act 2003. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to Police and Council officers with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 4) An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Hounslow Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 5) Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 6) A challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall operate at the premises. Signage shall be displayed advising customers that the scheme is in place. All staff authorised to sell alcohol will be trained in the Challenge 25 scheme and this training will be documented to include the date the training was given, the name of the person who gave the training, the person who received the training and signatures by both trainer and trainee.
- 7) Notices shall be prominently displayed advising patrons, CCTV is in operation within the premises.
- 8) Persons wishing to leave the premises to smoke shall not be permitted to take drinks with them.
- 9) Customers will not be permitted to remove from the premises any alcoholic drinks in open containers.
- 10) No alcohol shall be supplied if the CCTV equipment is inoperative for any reason.
- 11) In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
 - a) The police (and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance

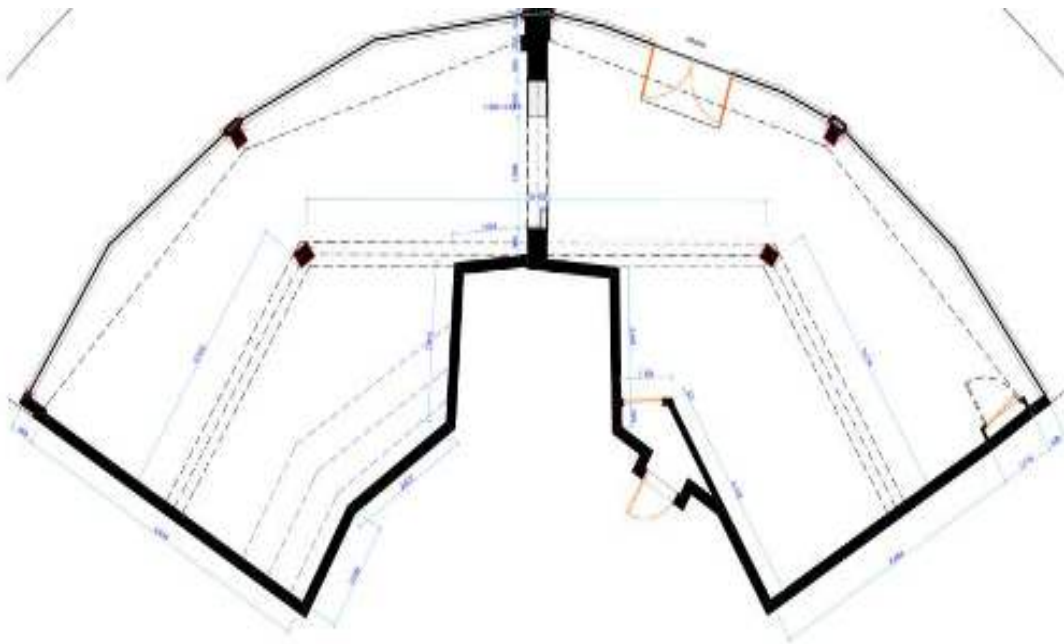


Service) are called without delay;

- b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the police;
- c) The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the police; and
- d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.

12) Alcohol will only be sold to a person ancillary to a substantial meal on site.
