 - Where/if applicable, provide a 2no. 12.5mm Gyproc Fireline plasterboard lining, on dot and dab, in accordance with the manufacturers details to achieve minimum 60mins FR protection.

- Doors & partitions required to be fire resisting are to be in accordance with British Standard B.S. 476 Pt. 3.
 - Fire resisting doors required to resist the passage of smoke at ambient temperature conditions should, unless tested in accordance with B.S. 476 section 311, to be fitted with a smoke seal.
 - The existing fire detection and warning system should be risk assessed and where necessary, be extended or amended to take account of the proposed alterations. Any additions or alterations should be in accordance with the recommendations of BS5839: Part 1 or an equivalent standard.
 - The existing emergency lighting provision should be risk assessed and where necessary, be extended or amended to take account of the proposed alterations. Any alterations should be in accordance with the current edition of BS5266: Part 1 or an equivalent standard.
 - Illuminated "EXIT" signs are to conform to British Standard B.S. 2660. All signage BS ISO 3864 - [19] clearly defining escape routes.
 - Fire fighting equipment to conform to British Standard B.S. 5423 & BS 5306-8 [38], all to LL's requirements.
 - Fire safety related signs & notices are to conform to British Standard B.S. 5449 Pt.1.

- Wall coverings which conform to BS EN 15102, achieving at least class C-s3, d2 and bonded to a class A2-s3, d2 substrate, will also be acceptable.
- All mechanical and catering equipment installation with regard to fire safety including Arenal system, fire rated ducting, fire and smoke dampers etc. as specialist details.
 - Upholstered seating furniture should satisfy, as a minimum standard, (ignition source), (cigarette test) specified in British Standard B.S. 5852 Pt 1 Fire tests for furniture - Methods of test for ignitability by smokers materials of upholstered composites for seating & British Standard B.S. 5852 Pt.2 Fire tests for furniture - Methods of tests for ignitability of upholstered composites for testing by flaming source'. For which latter standard crib ignition source 5 is the minimum requirement.
 - Any fabrics which have received a flame retardant treatment should be subjected to the water soak test detailed in British Standard B.S. 5651 independent certification to the above standards should be provided from an accredited test organisation.
 - Curtains & drapes are to satisfy type B, performance requirements of British Standard B.S. 5667 Pt.2.
 - Artificial foliage & other decorative effects are to be fire retardant to the satisfaction of the Fire Authority.
 - Textile floor coverings should be tested to British Standard B.S. 4790 (Effects of small ignition source hot metal nut method).
 - Vertically hung textiles should conform to British Standard B.S. 5438.

A copy of the laboratory test report form an accredited testing laboratory identifying compliance of the furnishings specified in this certificate have been installed in the premises.

- Where works affect the floor slab (other than ground), when making good, the floor must be fire stopped to ensure a minimum of sixty (60) minutes fire separation.
- All wall and ceiling voids above 750mm to have appropriate void detection installed to satisfy approved document B of the Building regulations, where applicable.
- Under regulation 38. The person carrying out the work shall give fire safety information to the responsible person not later than the date of completion of the work, or the date of occupation of the building or extension, whichever is earlier.

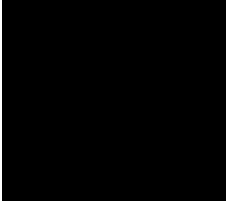

Annex 1 Mandatory Conditions

All Premises Licence authorising supply of alcohol

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence –
 - (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
 - (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
3.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
 - (3)
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or



- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person must ensure that –
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed



container) it is available to customers in the following measures –

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 –
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where –

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.



3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

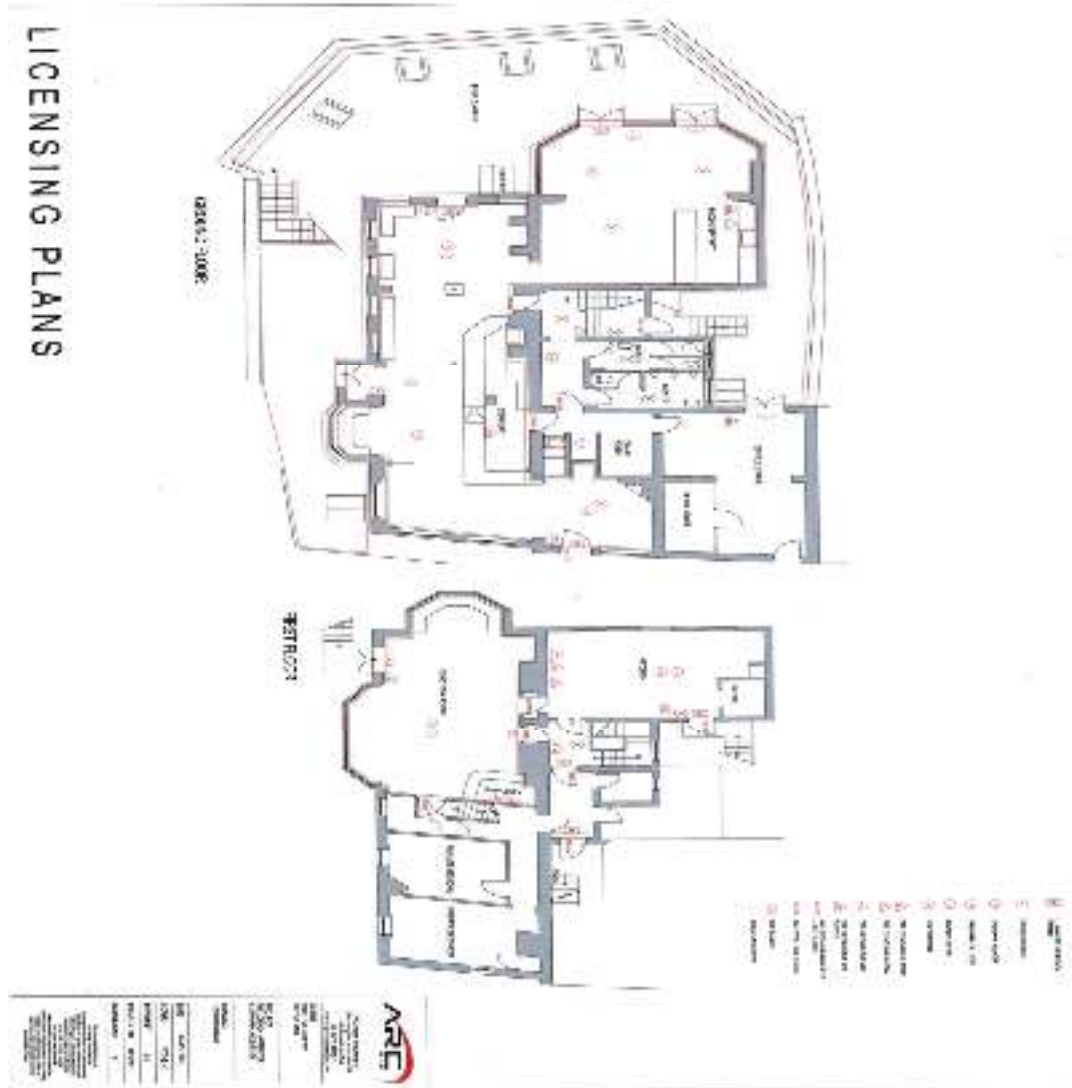
1. All instances of crime and disorder must be reported to the police and kept in an incident logbook.
2. Additional patrols must take place by members of staff, internally and externally, to limit any noise pollution when entertainment is being offered within the premises.
3. Children on the premises must be accompanied by a responsible adult and be under supervision at all times.
4. Restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 apply.
5. All outside areas must be closed by 22:00.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1. A notice must be clearly displayed inside the premises asking guests to leave the premises quietly and not to disturb neighbouring residents.
2. A notice must be clearly displayed informing customers that proof of age may be requested when alcohol is purchased.
3. Toughened glass containers must be used for all drinks consumed in outside areas.
4. Staff must carry out hourly litter patrols around the perimeter of the premises from 7 p.m. until the time premises is closed daily.
5. The licensee must carry out a risk assessment prior to any private functions.
